#### What does it mean to be a people of Liberating Love?

Happy New Year, Beloveds!

2024 promises to be a busy and exciting year for UUCB. On January 14, we will be welcoming new members into our beloved community, and we will take time to reflect on the meaning of membership and to appreciate the gifts we share as members of UUCB. There will be many opportunities for you to gather in groups to share your hopes and dreams for the future.

What does it mean to be a people of "liberating love?" My favorite quote about love has always been, "Love is like the five loaves and two fishes; it doesn't start to multiply until you give it away." This is derived from the meaning of bible miracle story of five thousand people being fed with five loaves of bread and two fishes. It is a story about generosity and sharing. It is a story about the power of love. As a child, I was taught in Christian Science Sunday School that God is Love. The only other definition of God that I have found better or equal is from Unitarian theologian, James Luther Adams who defined God as "community-forming power."

UUCB was awarded \$250,000 from the National Fund for Sacred Places because this church has been a transforming power both in the Buffalo community as well as in the lives of its members. Social justice and the power of love is embedded in the DNA of this church's history, but you don't have to look back any further than the past few months for examples of how this church shares its gifts of love, music, money, and hope with the community!



As you can see from the above graphic, the proposed revision to Article II places LOVE at its core. In January, we will explore the meaning of "Liberating Love," and on February 4, we will take a closer look at Article II and explore the proposed changes that begin with love:

Love is the power that holds us together and is at the center of our shared values. We are accountable to one another for doing the work of living our shared values through the spiritual discipline of Love.

I can't think of a better way to begin the New Year than exploring the gifts of this beloved community and the transformative power of love.





# Music Notes Dr. Jessie Downs, Music Director



January is a month of rest for our hard-working Music Ministry, but our Sunday services will nevertheless continue to brim with meaningful music – classical, jazz, rock, folk, and music theatre selections performed by our talented staff and volunteers.

**On January 7<sup>th</sup>,** UUCB congregant Bruce Pfeffer will provide piano music for Rabbi Jonathan's service, playing four lovely solo selections by 19<sup>th</sup> Century French virtuoso pianist Charles-Valentin Alkan.

**On January 14<sup>th</sup>,** UUCB staff pianist Christopher Sierzchula will share two solo pieces from his repertoire as the Prelude and Postlude. For the Offertory, Michael Harris will sing the tune "Sweet Beginning" from the jazzy musical The Roar of the Greasepaint as a special welcome to our new members. At the Reflection, Jessie Downs, Taryn Goehrig, and Helen Lowry will sing "One Voice" by The Wailin' Jennys - an anthem expressing the power of building community - with Paul Zanolli on guitar.

**On Saturday January 20**<sup>th</sup>, our Casual Concert series welcomes singer-songwriter Tyler Wescott. Westcott is said to "breathe new life into roots music spanning multiple genres and decades." He also creates new music inspired by the old. Armed with his trusty guitar, banjo, and harmonica, he has a knack for describing the human condition with humor and joy, often in timely and topical songs reflecting the current state of the world. Come out to support a super talented local artist at "pay-what-you-can" pricing!

On January 21<sup>st</sup>, Reverend Cathy will lead a sermon entitled Letting Go, and the UUCB Staff Musicians will share a variety of music centered around this theme. As the Prelude, Chris will sing and play Billy Joel's heart wrenching "And So it Goes." As the Offertory, Jessie, Taryn, and Helen will sing another arrangement by The Wailin' Jennys, this time of the traditional Celtic tune "The Parting Glass." As the Reflection, Shaun and Helen will reprise the stunning duet "How Could I Ever Know?" from the musical version of The Secret Garden – a song that portrays a grieved husband calling out to his departed wife. Finally, Taryn will sing the optimistic journeying song "By My Side" from Godspell with the other soloists on supporting vocals.

**On January 28<sup>th</sup>,** the UUCB Choir will come back from a well-deserved break to share excerpts from Johannes Brahms's Liebeslieder-Waltzer and Neue Liebeslieder song cycles, accompanied by Bruce Pfeffer and Martha Malkiewicz on piano 4-hands.

# Historic Home Owners Tax Credit Work Shop January 10<sup>th</sup> 5:30-7:00 in the Sanctuary

Preservation Buffalo Niagara, Preservation Studios and the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo are cosponsoring a free workshop on the New York State Historic Homeownership Rehabilitation Credit. The workshop is open to the public and participants will be walked through the user-friendly application, intended to be prepared and submitted by the homeowners, themselves. Owner-occupied homes in the City of Buffalo that are on the National Register, either individually designated or as contributing to a National Register Historic District, are eligible for the 20% Tax Credit.
